


2015 AN-NUAL RE-PORT

DUS INTERNATIONAL PERFORMING ARTS FESTIVAL



The 2015 PuSh International Performing Arts Festival marked the beginning of our second decade. And with this turning of a page, another chapter of the PuSh Festival story has unfolded.

To start, it was a year of artistic and audience breakthroughs. The three weeks of the Festival launched with breathtaking works by dance icon Louise Lecavalier and international circus stars Les 7 doigts de la main. Both productions enjoyed enthusiastic sold-out houses— an extra matinee of the circus show was added to meet demand. Equally audacious was Le Grand Continental®, which starred 75 community dancers in a public outdoor performance. (A documentary called Between the Lines, funded by TELUS Optik Local, was commissioned to capture this remarkable community-building endeavour.) Other highlights include innovative works created for public spaces by two leading Dutch artists, a first-time presentation of work from the Democratic Republic of the Congo, and the return of a Festival favourite: Marianno Pensotti from Argentina. Club PuSh on Granville Island was once again a dynamic performance and social hub, opening with Austin's Christeene, who set a decidedly raunchy tone. Ivan Coyote returned to Club PuSh with a punch, political and heartwarming in equal measure, selling out an added late-night performance.

Just as notable is our new co-located space at 750 Hamilton Street: The Post at 750. The move was engineered in partnership with three of Vancouver's most trusted arts organizations: DOXA Documentary Film Festival, Music on Main and Touchstone Theatre. A \$2.1 million capital campaign, an inspiring administrative and creative facility, and an innovative model for cooperation, mutual growth and community impact—this has been a major undertaking, and sets the course for the next stage our organization's life.

So the story continues. Exciting opportunities will arise, as ongoing challenges will persist. A new strategic vision is now called for, if we are to remain resilient and fulfill our mission in our second decade. But what remains unchanged, what continues to drive the PuSh Festival narrative, is our unwavering belief that creativity and the live performing arts are central to our communal future, to Vancouver's civic and social life, and to the province's economic well-being and brand.

MAY 2014

Kiss the Rabbit, a documentary about the PuSh Festival celebrating its 10th anniversary in 2014, premieres at Vancity Theatre.

JUNE 2014

Roxanne Duncan joins the PuSh Festival as Managing Director, as Founding Managing Director Minna Schendlinger steps down after nine years.

AUGUST 2014

Construction begins on The Post at 750, a new 8,500-square foot co-located administrative and production space in downtown Vancouver, spearheaded by the PuSh Festival with its partners DOXA Documentary Film Festival, Music on Main and Touchstone Theatre.

SEPTEMBER 2014

Recruitment and auditions begin for 75 non-professional dancers to perform *Le Grand Continental®*, an outdoor public dance to take place at the 2015 PuSh Festival. Selected cast rehearses for three months in preparation for the January performances.

NOVEMBER 2014

PuSh announces the 2015 Festival programming, featuring over 250 performances and events from January 20 to February 8.

PuSh Festival presents *The Love Song of R. Buckminster Fuller* by Academy Award-nominated director Sam Green with live score performed by Yo La Tengo, to a sold-out house at the Vogue Theatre.

DECEMBER 2014

PuSh Festival moves into its newly constructed headquarters at The Post at 750, which features inspiring design of office, communal and rehearsal spaces and operates in an innovative cooperative model.

400 Four- and Six-Show PuSh Passes sell out for the 2015 Festival to eager and enthusiastic PuSh patrons.

JANUARY 2015

2015 PuSh Festival launches with two sold-out performances by Canadian dance icon Louise Lecavalier in her choreographic debut, *So Blue*.

Séquence 8, by Quebec circus company Les 7 doigts de la main, is a runaway hit at the Vancouver Playhouse and a sold-out matinee performance is added to the three-night run.

2,600 people attend four jubilant performances of Le Grand Continental® at the Queen Elizabeth Plaza, in the rain and sun.

FEBRUARY 2015



PuSh International Performing Arts Festival engages and enriches audiences with adventurous contemporary works in a spirit of innovation & dialogue. The PuSh Festival is one of Vancouver's signature events. Produced over three weeks each January, the Festival presents groundbreaking work in the live performing arts.


