






The 2023 PuSh Youth Program encompassed the Youth Pass, Youth Assembly, and Youth Cohort.

The Youth Pass provided \$5 tickets for youth 16-24.

The Youth Assembly, a free, 1-day youth conference held during the PuSh Festival provided an opportunity for youth to meet and exchange with artists and arts professionals.

The Youth Cohort was a 6-month program for youth to experience, examine and engage in the professional contemporary performing arts community through artist workshops and discussions, studio visits, and a variety of performances. It was produced and created in collaboration with Surrey-based Solid State Community Industries. The free Youth Cohort program served suburban youth from newcomer families, several of whom experienced their first professional, contemporary arts performances at the Festival. This year, the program was run by Medley, a group of previous Youth Cohort participants, who managed the program under the mentorship of PuSh and Solid State leadership.

INDUSTRY SERIES

Presented in partnership with Talking Stick and SFU Woodward's Cultural Programs, the 2023 Industry Series was curated through an Indigenous lens, and saw delegates once again meeting in person.
